The Gospel of John, Chapter 1: 1-18

- 1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.
- 2 He was in the beginning with God.
- 3 All things came into being through Him, and apart from Him nothing came into being that has come into being.
- 4 In Him was life, and the life was the Light of men.
- The Light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not comprehend it.
- There came a man sent from God, whose name was John.
- He came as a witness, to testify about the Light, so that all might believe through him.
- 8 He was not the Light, but he came to testify about the Light.
- 9 There was the true Light which, coming into the world, enlightens every man.
- 10 He was in the world, and the world was made through Him, and the world did not know Him.
- 11 He came to His own, and those who were His own did not receive Him.
- 12 But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, even to those who believe in His name.
- 13 who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.
- 14 And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw His glory, glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth.
- 15 John testified about Him and cried out, saying, "This was He of whom I said, He who comes after me has a higher rank than I, for He existed before me."
- 16 For of His fullness we have all received, and grace upon grace.
- 17 For the Law was given through Moses; grace and truth were realized through Jesus Christ.
- 18 No one has seen God at any time; the only begotten God who is in the bosom of the Father, He has explained Him.

Who is Jesus?

- Read John 1:1-18 again and circle any synonyms, just as you circled Word.
- What did you learn about the Word? Look at each place you marked and make a list about what you see.
- According to verse 1, who is He? How is He described?
- What else do you learn about the Word from verse 14?
- According to verse 14, what are the characteristics of the Word?
- Read verses 14-18 and draw a box around the phrase grace & truth

Reflect:

Who is 'the Word'?

What kind of response do you need to make in light of what you have discovered?

Have you received Him, are you a child of God, do you believe in His name?
